

HOW TO PRINT AND USE THE BULLETIN INSERTS

To support each Special Sunday, simply print the PDF template. This is designed to fit 8.5x11 size paper. When printing, select print fit to page, print on both sides, flip on long edge and portrait orientation. See below for a visual. For a sturdy insert, print on card stock.

Once printed, trim out each insert and place them in each bulletin or in high traffic areas. Share them during worship services, Sunday School, or small group gatherings to encourage participation in the Special Sunday. Templates are available in both color and black-and-white for your convenience.
