

HOW TO PRINT AND USE THE PEW CARDS

Pew cards are a great way to share and teach about each Church-wide Special Sunday. Here's how to use them:


1. **Download the PDF template we've provided.** It's already set up for standard 8.5×11-inch paper.
2. **Choose your paper:**
 - For sturdier cards, use cardstock (thicker paper you can buy at office supply stores).
 - Regular printer paper works fine too.
3. **Print the file:** Open the PDF and select "Print" from your computer or device. Make sure your printer settings match the paper size (8.5×11).
4. **Cut out the cards:** Use scissors or a paper cutter to separate each card along the dotted lines.
5. **Place and share:** Put the cards in pew racks, bulletins, or high-traffic areas in your church. You can also hand them out during worship, Sunday School, or small group meetings.

TIP: If printing isn't possible for your group, you can still share the pew card content by using the worship image we provide. You can post it online or display it during worship.

PRINTING TIPS:

1. Select "Fit to page"
2. Choose "Print on both sides"
3. Use "Flip on long edge"
4. Set to "Portrait" orientation
